#### What Is Internet?

- "No. A lot of people use it to communicate with NBC writers and producers," replies Couric, looking off-stage for a producer for help explaining a topic she clearly knows little about. "Allison, can you explain what internet is?"

From offstage, a man's voice says, "It's a giant computer network... it's ... it's a computer billboard... it's... several universities all joined together."

- "And others can access it?" a confused Gumbel asks.
- "It's getting bigger every day," the voice from offstage replies.
- "That's great," Gumbel says sarcastically.

And more than that, we can speak his name to people whose lives have been ravaged by the relentlessly changing world around them, giving them hope, purpose and destiny.


