Christmas Is Not a Christian Holiday

When you title your lead article for your congregation's December newsletter something so controversial, you better follow it up with Agame material. Christmas is not a Christian holiday. But how could it not be; after all, it has the word CHRIST in it?!

Well, first, there's history. In 1870, President Grant declared Christmas to be a National Holiday. A fact for which Federal Employees remain grateful. School children are also glad that Christmas is recognized as a holiday at the local level. (Give us time, kids; we'll try to get them to give you Reformation Day off. October 31st. And yes, I know there's competition for that day.)

But there's also sound doctrine behind wanting Christmas not to be recognized as a Christian holiday. If we say that Christmas is a Christian holiday, what we are saying is that people who do not identify as Christians should not celebrate the birth of Jesus of Nazareth. But people who do not identify themselves as Christians should celebrate the birth of Jesus, even if their understanding of what his birth means still needs some work.

The Jesus whose birth we celebrate on the holiday called Christmas would go on to live a perfect life, die miserably on the cross, conquer death in his resurrection, ascend into heaven, and send the Holy Spirit to bring all people to faith and repentance. And he is the same Son of God who will come again to judge the living and the dead, to whom all knees shall bow, and who reigns forever and ever.

If his grace and mercy, love and compassion extends to all people, why would we say that his birth should only be celebrated by a few? Our call as Christians is not to keep the uninformed from celebrating the birth of the one we know has saved them from sin and death, but to give them the reason why his birth is worth celebrating.

God bless you as you celebrate the birth of the Son of God, our Lord Jesus Christ.



BRIDGEVILLE FOOD BANK NEWS

Starting November 16, you will have the opportunity to participate in purchasing a gift of clothing or toy for a Child registered with the Bridgeville Area Food Bank. If you wish to participate, choose an angel gift tag from the tree set up in the back of the Church. Each gift tag is marked with an age and size for clothing. If the tag has child's age and gender only, the gift should be a toy. Your unwrapped gift Costing around twenty dollars will need to be returned with the gift tag attached no later than Sunday, **DECEMBER 14**.

Zion Lutheran Church is a part of the area ministerial. The ministerial is formed by many local churches in the surrounding Bridgeville area. Volunteers representing the area churches come together to serve the people in need who live in the South Fayette and Chartiers Valley School districts. Our ministry is ongoing throughout the year and serves around one hundred-twenty families each month.

There are many ways in which you are able to support the food bank throughout the year. You may bring non-perishable food and place it in the Narthex. Financially, you may give a monetary donation with the check written to the <u>Bridgeville Area Food Bank</u>.
