## Because of Their Faith

We've seen it many times before; horrible images burned into our conscience reminding us that if the world hated Jesus it will hate his followers too. Led like lambs to the slaughter, our brothers in Christ paraded in front of cameras in a professionally choreographed horror story. Their captors, dressed in black, showing no mercy, cannot even satiate their hate by killing the innocent. Killed along the coastline with the water calling to mind the sinful state of the world reminiscent of the days of Noah; also reminding the faithful of their baptism into the name of the Triune God.

Dressed in orange, these Christian men met their death as so many who have borne the name of Christ have been called to do since the resurrection of our Lord. A White House spokesman said, in response to the killing: "That these terrorists killed these men solely because of their faith lays bare the terrorists' vicious, senseless brutality." Registration is open for Everest VBS - Conquering challenges with God's might power! Cost is \$15 per child or a maximum of \$40 per family.


