Too Busy to Worship...

...and other lies we tell ourselves and others.

From the moment we wake up (or are woken up) until the moment we go to sleep, we make decisions. These decisions, taken together, reflect the priorities we have established for ourselves. From the simple, "will I brush my teeth this morning?" to the complex, "will I re-evaluate my investment portfolio based on the market fluctuations?" to the frivolous, "will I have a non-fat iced chai latte or a regular coffee?" to the serious, "do I need to have a talk with my child about what I saw them looking at on-line?" we have an unfathomable amount of decisions to make each and every day. ("Will I finish reading this article?")

One decision, more than any other, that can profoundly effect the rest of your week is the decision whether or not to come to worship on Sunday morning (or Wednesday evening!). So many people tell me the same thing: "I feel like something is off when I skip church." And something is off.

All during the week the world, the devil and your own sinful flesh beat you up, drag you down and try to convince you that a loving God does not exist, and that if he does, you certainly are unworthy of his grace and mercy. Hopelessness, or worse, apathy sets in and you find yourself going through motions that seem increasingly meaningless. The one place you can go to take a deep breath and be reminded of the truth, that there is a God who loves you, a Savior who died for you, and that you have already been given the gift of eternal life, is church. But whether or not you come to church is up to you. No one is going to honk the horn outside of your house on Sunday morning and offer you a ride; you (and you alone) have the make the decision to set the alarm clock on Saturday night to get you up out of bed on Sunday morning. You (and you alone) have to decide if kids games, a late night on Saturday, a long easy breakfast, or spending time in the great outdoors is more important than hearing the Gospel of Jesus Christ and receiving the body and blood of your Savior.

As many times as I've heard people tell me that something is off when they skip church, I've heard people tell me the tired old excuse: "we're just too busy" to make time for worship on Sunday morning or Wednesday evening. Now, I'm not saying people do not have a lot going on. As the father of two young kids, I know what it is like to be pulled in many different competing directions. But let me say, at the risk of sounding insensitive, that if you have time to go on-line, watch TV, or go out to dinner, you are not too busy to find time to go to church; there are simply other things you have chosen to prioritize over church.

Nobody is too busy to worship. We are too busy to do everything else and worship.

Now, that's a lot of LAW for Pastor's Monthly Newsletter. But I think it needs to be said because too many of us have convinced ourselves that Sunday Worship is what we do when there is nothing else going on, instead of marking it on the calendar as a non-negotiable priority.

So, in good Lutheran fashion, I'll follow up that LAW with some GOSPEL...

Back to Basics

For 2015 Zion is going Back to Basics! We're spending time on Sunday morning going over the basic truths of the Christian Faith. We started with the 10 Commandments and are generally be following the outline of Luther's Small Catechism. If you miss a week here or there, recordings of the sermons are available on our website (zlcb.org). Also, at our Wednesday Evening Service of Prayer and Preaching, we take what we looked at on Sunday and take it a little bit more in depth. We also answer the questions that are asked on Sunday... or try to answer them as best we can at our Wednesday Evening Service of Prayer and Preaching. We hope you can join us for worship!

BLAY 16 Back in 2012, Zion embarked on the ambitious task of reading through the Bible in one year. Daily readings were posted on-line, in the worship bulletin and in the monthly newsletter. Downloadable audio files of the Bible being read were made available on our website, the sermon came from the previous week's readings, and the midweek Bible studies focused on the reading for that day. Zion went all-in to get as many people as possible committing to the marathon goal of reading the Bible cover-to-cover. Feedback was, to put it mildly, positive.

And so now, four years later, we are going to do it again!

For 2016, we are going to read the Bible In A Year. Like last time, the sermon on Sunday will be based on one of the readings from the previous week. On Wednesday, when we're not studying Romans or celebrating Lent or Advent, the Midweek Sermon will be on the Bible in a Year reading for that day. We will have a reading list posted on-line, in your weekly Bulletin, and in the monthly Newsletter. For those who would prefer to listen to the Bible

being read instead of reading it for yourself, audio files of the Bible being read will also be available on the Church Website. Why are we doing this?

Like running a marathon, you have a greater chance of success to reach your goal of reading the Bible in a year if you are part of a team. Knowing what is in God's Word helps you navigate through the twists and turns of life in the world as a child of God. Reading the Bible draws you closer to Christ, strengths your faith, and gives the Holy Spirit room to work in your life! If you read through the Bible back in 2012, my guess is that (like me) you either forgot some (most?) of what you read, or had a hard time understanding some (most?) of it the first time around. Why not do it again? I'll be joining you as we, once again, Read the Bible In A Year in 2016.

A sign-up sheet will be available in the narthex/entryway, or you can call or e-mail Pastor Duncan or the Church Secretaries if you are interested in attending!




~Starting September 15th we will be having "Moms in Prayer" @ 9:00am. We will meet in the conference room! Come join us as we pray together.
