Welcome to Worship!

Our Psalm for this evening gives a vivid description of the tactics of David's enemies as they pursue him. They whet their tongues like swords, they aim their bitter words like arrows, and they lay snares to entrap him. So many of the Psalms written by David come from situations like this. David's enemies are following after him, trying to take his life and dishonor the name of the LORD as they put an end to His king. David cries out to God to save him, and like a mighty warrior God acts on behalf of his servant.

The attacks of Satan are described in similar ways by Scripture and Christian hymnody (one such hymn will be mentioned in the message), "The old evil foe now means deadly woe", "Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion", "the flaming darts of the evil one". James is very cautious of the attacks that Satan will throw at his hearers. He specifically mentions resisting the devil in chapter 4, but his warnings in our text from last week and tonight are also given in light of the attacks of the deceiver. Martin Luther once said that in Baptism we "hang around the child's neck such a mighty, lifelong enemy." As baptized children of God we are in opposition to Satan and he would love to take us down, but God does not leave us to fight Satan alone. He gives us weapons, chiefly the Word of the Gospel, which is a death sentence to Satan and his minions as it proclaims the victory of Jesus over death and eternal life for all who believe.

They hold fast to their evil purpose; they talk of laying snares secretly, thinking, "Who can see them?" They search out injustice, saying, "We have accomplished a diligent search." For the inward mind and heart of a man are deep. But God shoots his arrow at them; they are wounded suddenly. They are brought to ruin, with their own tongues turned against them; all who see them will wag their heads. Then all mankind fears; they tell what God has brought about and ponder what he has done.

Let the righteous one rejoice in the Lord and take refuge in him! Let all the upright in heart exult! Let your glory be over all the earth!

Reading: James 1:19-27

Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God. Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls.

But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing.

If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.
