

Welcome to worship!

We are blessed to have Pastor Eric Andrae with us this morning to preach God's Word and give us the Lord's Supper. But seeing as I don't know anything about his sermon, I'd like to give you a few things to think about in the aftermath of the election. These were composed before the results were in, and I think they apply if you love the results or hate them.

- 1. As we proceed as a country we all need to pray. Our incoming leaders, our outgoing leaders, and all elected officials (whether we voted for them or not) need our prayers.
- 2. God's Word speaks about government and the relation that we have to our elected officials. Check out the words of Paul in Romans Chapter 13 and the words of Jesus in Matthew 22:15-22. We have much to learn this year and about government in general just from the first verse of Romans 13 "Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God." 3. We trust God in all things. Psalm 146:3 exhorts "Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation." He rules over both the civil realm and the spiritual realm. We trust him and not any elected official for our salvation. If you are thrilled about the results of the election, be on guard that the president-elect does not become a god to you. Rejoice that the government is going in the right direction, but keep that joy in the proper place. If you are dismayed about the election results, take heart that God has your salvation in His hand, and trust that even if you disagree with any of our elected officials, their authority is from God. God rules over all things, and the message of salvation in Christ is unchanging. May God Bless you as you receive His gifts this morning!

Gospel Reading: Luke 21:5-28

And while some were speaking of the temple, how it was adorned with noble stones and offerings, he said, "As for these things that you see, the days will come when there will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down." And they asked him, "Teacher, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when these things are about to take place?" And he said, "See that you are not led astray. For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is at hand!' Do not go after them. And when you hear of wars and tumults, do not be terrified, for these things must first take place, but the end will not be at once."

Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and pestilences. And there will be terrors and great signs from heaven. But before all this they will lay their hands on you and persecute you, delivering you up to the synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought

before kings and governors for my name's sake. This will be your opportunity to bear witness. Settle it therefore in your minds not to meditate beforehand how to answer, for I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which none of your adversaries will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be delivered up even by parents and brothers and relatives and friends, and some of you they will put to death. You will be hated by all for my name's sake. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your lives.

"But when you see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, then know that its desolation has come near. Then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains, and let those who are inside the city depart, and let not those who are out in the country enter it, for these are days of vengeance, to fulfill all that is written. Alas for women who are pregnant and for those who are nursing infants in those days! For there will be great distress upon the earth and wrath against this people. They will fall by the edge of the sword and be led captive among all nations, and Jerusalem will be trampled underfoot by the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled.

"And there will be signs in sun and moon and stars, and on the earth distress of nations in perplexity because of the roaring of the sea and the waves, people fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world. For the powers of the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
