## Church, Mission & Synod (CMS) & Plate Finances

As of September 11, 2010, we are estimating \$23,980 cash on hand. All bills through September 11<sup>th</sup> have been paid. The high cash on hand is due to a number of Preschool families who paid their tuition in full. We are establishing a special account to ensure prepaid tuition dollars are spread across the calendar year.
