1) Outreach, 2) In-reach, 3) Youth Ministry and Early Childhood Program, 4) Worship Service, 5) Stewardship, 6) Technology, and 7) Church and Parsonage Facilities.

Outreach - Build and expand the outreach program around the existing programs and services.

In-Reach – Build and expand the in-reach programs by utilizing the existing Interaction committee.

Youth Ministry and Early Childhood Program - Develop a vision to expand and improve the current programs and services. Develop new programs and services offering to take advantage of existing staff and facilities.

Worship Services – Maintain traditional worship services while exploring new ministry options and worship service trends.

Stewardship – Develop proactive personal and financial stewardship programs. **Technology** – Proactively leverage technology to improve overall ministry.

Church and Parsonage Facilities - Develop a proactive 1, 3 and 5-year maintenance facilities and building plan.

The above focus areas are in support of Zion's purpose and mission to carry out the Great Commission of our Lord, preaching and teaching the Word of God to all creation; to bring the lost to faith in Christ; to establish and strengthen the saints through Word and Sacrament; to equip them for ministry in the priesthood of all believers; to encourage them to works of charity; and to send them out into the world.


fore and after services and meetings at the church. Please sign up as soon as possible to get the best appointment to fit your schedule.

On behalf of the Bridgeville Area Food Bank (BAFB), we thank everyone who participated in the Christmas Angel Tree project. There has been an increase in need for the food bank with the recent financial crisis and layoffs. We are experiencing many new households signing up for assistance. At the November distribution we had twenty new households register.

In addition, an "item of the month" will be suggested as we combine efforts with other area churches to collect what the BAFB calls extras.
