ALL THINGS LENT

Lent is almost here, that time of the church year when we look at Christ as well as the spiritual disciplines in our own lives. First, we look to Christ, focusing on His passion (the events leading up to His death on the cross) and all that He suffered as He bore our sins and faced the awesome judgment of God. Then we look at our lives: how are we living as recipients of His grace in response to His forgiveness? Traditionally, Christians have used the Lenten season to either adopt a spiritual discipline (or physical discipline) or refrain from something they fear might have become their God (TV, desserts, etc).

During Lent, our focus on the weekends will be our continued study on

the Gospel of John, paying careful attention to the words, deeds, and identity of Jesus; learning what the Apostle whom Jesus Loved has written about the Lord. During "Holy Week" we will have services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, as well as on Easter Sunday. These services will focus exclusively on the suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ. We will also have mid-week services during Lent on Wednesdays at 7:00pm. As with our Advent



services, these will be shorter than our Sunday services and more devotional and contemplative in nature. Our focus during these services will be the spiritual discipline of prayer. Each week, we will take a look at a prayer found in Scripture. We'll learn what they prayed for and how their example can help us when we come to the Lord in prayer. The services will be followed by deserts and coffee in the undercroft (church basement), for those who want to stick around for fellowship and informal discussion on the sermon.

Don't forget, in addition to all the worship opportunities, we have a Youth Choir (10-12th grade) coming in from Michigan to perform a concert of Sacred Music at our church on the 26th at 7:00pm. In addition to the concert, we have an opportunity to show hospitality and support for these young adults by hosting them in our homes. Please let the church office know if you'll be able to host any of the high school students who will be coming to perform for us to the glory of God.

March is looking to be an exciting, faith-filled, Christ-centered month at Zion! Hope you'll be able to be a part of it... All the best,

As of February 19, 2011, we are estimating \$10,800 cash on hand. All bills through February 20th have been paid.

The unfavorable monthly income was mainly due to higher than expected snow removal costs. Continue to pray for Zion that we are able to grow our outreach ministry and that we can maintain this positive financial picture for 2011.

these very valuable services for our families, free of charge. Phipps Conservatory will be presenting programs on seeds and planting. This program is made possible through our fund-raising activities.



The A Cappella & Chamber Choirs


2011 Concert Tour




"THE GOSPEL OF JOHN"


