#### "AND I WILL RAISE HIM UP ON THE LAST DAY"

As I'm writing my article for this month's newsletter, the upcoming message for Sunday looms in the back of my mind. The message is on the middle part of the Bread of Life discourse from John 6. Fitting that this would be the topic the week the "Pre-Easter" newsletter is due.

Did you know that Jesus uses the phrase: "I will raise him up on the last day" four times in the "Bread of Life" discourse? (Incidentally, this is also the number of times Jesus calls himself the "bread of life.") You could make the case that this part of John's Gospel, instead of being referred to as the "Bread of Life Discourse" should be referred to as the "I will raise him up on the last day" discourse.

The two go hand-in-hand, actually. The "bread" that is Jesus is designed to give us life, just like the rye, white, and wheat bread that we eat sustains life. Only with Jesus, the life he creates, gives and sustains is not temporary.

Easter is right around the corner. The celebration of the resurrection of the Son of God is the highlight of the Christian year. But ask the average Christian what the resurrection of Christ means, and, after looking like a deer in headlights for a second or two, they will say something about either heaven or the forgiveness of sins. And while those are both in the background on Easter, its true meaning is something else... something better. Jesus rose from the dead; a fact that we remember every week, but especially on Easter Sunday. Because Jesus rose from the dead, we will rise from the dead.

Unless he returns soon, we will all have to experience death. But the good news is that death, while tragic, the "wages of sin" and the "last enemy" is not final! The "Bread of Life" will see to it that we do not remain in our graves, but will give us life.

Jesus gives us himself, the "Bread of Life" in this life. But it is not until he will "raise [us] up on the last day" that what he has given us will be manifested. We have this "Bread," that is, Jesus, now. But what he will do for us is temporarily hidden, but it is revealed in his resurrection, and promised in his word.

Raised up on the last day because we have been given the Bread of Life, Jesus Christ.

#### LIMiT

We have some updates for the Lutheran Island Mission Trip, scheduled for 6/25-7/1!

There are a couple of information meetings for those who are considering going. The first one is April 17<sup>th</sup> after the late service in the church Undercroft (basement). We'll go over the details of the trip and answer any questions you might have.

The second LIMiT meeting is scheduled for May 22<sup>nd</sup> after the late service in the church Undercroft (basement). This is the "Commitment" meeting where we will have people sign up and commit to going on the trip.

The cost for LIMiT is \$300 and includes transportation and meals, lodging and "program" when we get to the camp. We're keeping the costs low by using private vehicles to drive to and from Lutheran Island Camp. If you want to drive your vehicle, the church will cover the cost of your expenses at Lutheran Island Camp (\$270). Half of the \$300 will be due on June 1st and the second half on the 22nd.
