BUDGET REPORT



The unfavorable monthly expenses were a result of July giving being less than budgeted (which seems to occur each year during the summer vacation months), an overlap of salaries for the out-going and in-coming Preschool Director for July and August, and some additional expenses: new computers, carpet and repair bills.

We expect August to improve as we receive preschool tuition payments and members return back from their vacations.

Sermon Text Bible Studies—Wednesday Evenings @ 7:00 & Thursday Mornings @ 10:00


Everyone is welcome to attend a Bible study in the Conference Room led by Pastor Duncan on the sermon text for the coming Sunday.
