## **Giving Thanks Together**

The men's Monday Morning Bible Breakfast has been spending its time studying Luther's Large Catechism. (Luther wrote the Large Catechism as the companion piece for the Small Catechism. Ideally, the Head of the Household would study the Large Catechism so that he could better teach the Small Catechism to his family.) Last night, I had a request for a copy of Luther's "95 Theses" from a member of the congregation. This weekend our focus in worship is on the gospel of Jesus Christ as it was rediscovered in the 16<sup>th</sup> Century through what became known as the Protestant Reformation.

November is a month overshadowed by football and the start of the holiday season with the celebration of Thanksgiving. For my family, this year has been one with many blessings for which to be thankful. For others in our congregation this year has been one of unmatched difficulties: death, sickness, unemployment and personal struggles. And for some other families, this year came and went without so much as memory worth holding onto. Regardless of the events that made up the last year, we all have much for which to be thankful.

We have the gospel of Jesus Christ: the forgiveness of sins on account of the person and work of Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of Man and Son of God, the promise and reality of eternal life now, and a relationship with our Father in heaven. We also have a strong tradition of Bible-based teaching and doctrine that goes back to the prophets and apostles of the Old and New Testament. This teaching was "rediscovered" by the reformers of the church in the 16<sup>th</sup> century and has been carefully handed down to us through the years.

At a time when truth is a commodity more questioned than trusted, it's good to have a solid foundation when it comes to the most important things in life: our belief in a good and gracious God, the full forgiveness given to us by His Son, and a rebirth and regeneration by His Spirit. As a congregation of believers, this is something we can all be thankful for!

#### Advent is rapidly approaching!

Like last year, Advent services will start at 7:00pm on Wednesday starting the week after Thanksgiving. A dinner will be provided before the service starting at 6:00pm.

Our theme will be "Before Christ in the Gospels." We'll be taking a look at how each of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) treats the time before Jesus was born. No two gospels are alike and I think you'll be excited by what you'll discover!

## **Notes From the Preschool**

"Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good." This is the Bible verse the preschool will be focusing on for the month of November. The Lord has truly been good to our school. We have been blessed with beautiful children, supportive and loving families, and a wonderful staff.

October has been a month full of excitement and exploration. The children explored so many of God's creations including October's most popular creation (at least, according to the children) the PUMPKIN!! I had the pleasure of presenting the chapel lesson this month with the children. The lesson was called "The Parable of the Pumpkin" I wanted to convey the Gospel message in a visual way, so we used pumpkins. Two carved pumpkins were presented side by side to the children. One has a smiling face and a lit candle inside, emitting a pleasant and warm glow. The other frowning pumpkin is dark inside. The children were asked which pumpkin they would rather be. "The happy one" they shouted! The children are told that Jesus is the Light of the World, and that He can provide a light to guide their lives if they love Him with their whole heart. When the children saw the sad and dark pumpkin I explained that life without Jesus would be dark and sad. The children were then asked how they think the "light" got inside of the pumpkin since the top was not cut. After guessing many interesting ways, I turned the pumpkin around and pulled out a heart shape, carved in the back of the pumpkin. The children are told that if they faithfully love Jesus with their hearts, souls, and minds, He will always be with them. The book "The Pumpkin Patch Parable" was also read to the children. It is our prayer that these two activities help to make the Gospel message clear and meaningful to the children.

The month was also filled with field trips to local pumpkin farms, a visit from Firefighter Phil, picture days, and Fall Harvest parties. What a pleasure it is to hear



all of these happy voices each day. Please come and look at some of the wonderful pictures Mrs. Rita took this month. They are posted in the hallway outside of the classrooms.

Our Road Rally fundraiser again proved to be a huge success. We raised nearly \$2,700. We are hoping to raise enough money to provide some much needed new playground equipment.

The Lord is good, indeed!



To help the local hospitals and patients who desperately rely on a safe and adequate blood supply in this region, we have scheduled a **Thanksgiving Weekend Blood drive** for **Saturday, November 26th, 2011 from 9:00am to 2:00pm** in the playroom. Our goal is to collect 60 pints of blood, which will be used to help save lives over the crucial Thanksgiving holiday period. All donors will receive two movie tickets to Carmike Cinemas!

To donate, you must be at least 16 years old, weigh at least 110 pounds and be in good health. You are eligible to donate every 56 days. Medications such as insulin, aspirin, and high blood pressure treatments do not defer you from donating.
