#### **WELCOME TO ADVENT!**

This year at Zion we've got an exciting sermon series for our midweek Advent services: "Advent According to the Four Gospels." Did you know that the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) deal with the time before Jesus came differently? (Very differently, in some cases.) During our midweek services we'll be taking a look at how the four gospels each deal uniquely with the time before Christ's first coming. We'll be worshiping at 7:00pm on Wednesdays starting on November 30<sup>th</sup> and continuing through the Advent season. Like last year, dinner will be served at 6:00 before all of our Advent services. I hope you and your family will be able to make it to these services!

As stated above, we're in the Advent season of the Church Year. Advent is the season when we remember the events that took place to prepare people for Christ's first coming (Christmas) and look forward to his second coming (Parousia, End of the Age, Apocalypse, etc). When Jesus came for the first time his coming was announced by angels. When Jesus began his ministry as an adult, John the Baptist prepared his way. But when it comes to Christ's Second Advent (at the End of the Age), people will not be prepped by angels or a prophet of biblical proportions; they will be prepared by people like you and me. And the good news for us is that it is the Good News that prepares people for the second coming of Christ! The Gospel of our salvation: the death and resurrection of Christ, the free gift of forgiveness and God's unmerited favor given without cost through faith in Jesus Christ is what prepares people for Jesus' coming at the End of the Age. Just as the angels announced the first coming of Christ with songs of praise, our message to the world about Christ's second coming is also cause for a celebration! Christ is coming soon! Alleluia!

#### Website Anniversary

Zion's updated website was launched on Christmas eve, 2010 and it has succeeded well beyond our expectations. We've had close to 30,000 page views since the site launched (that excludes hits by robot search engines that catalog the internet). So we're talking real people viewing our content ... 30,000 views! We've posted over 100 Sermons and Gospel readings as audio recordings (Podcasts), which you can subscribe to, and there have been well over 400 daily posts (in less than a year).

Visitors can also access Sunday or mid-week service bulletins, monthly calendars and the newsletter. Other popular content includes What We Believe, Bible Study notes, VBS information, a photo gallery, quizzes and a number of videos. We also have an up-to-date "This Week at Zion" section (on the main page) for a quick overview of what's going on this week at Zion.

Finally, bigger and better things are on the way when you consider our "Read the Bible in a Year" program. Each and every day, we will have the complete daily text posted along with an optional audio recording of the days readings. #### **Notes From the Preschool**

Greetings from the Preschool! We hope everyone had a blessed Thanksgiving. We have been busy little Pilgrims and Indians this November....I'm not even sure where I should start! I think I'll start with our very generous donations to the Bridgeville Area Food Bank. During the month of November we asked the children to bring in food items for the food bank. We explained that the food bank is where people who don't have enough money to buy food can go and get food. They brought in so much food that we were able to send 16 bags to the food bank. It made the children feel good to know that they were helping little children just like them. Children are truly amazing in their capacity to understand real topics when presented in a way that relates to them.

We also did our first mission project in November. The project was called Operation Christmas Child. Since 1993 Operation Christmas Child has shared the Good News of God's love with children worldwide who are living in desperate circumstances. Simple gifts such as school supplies, toys, and personal items were collected and packed into shoeboxes. The gift shoeboxes are

then distributed around the world, representing the love and hope of Jesus Christ to the children who receive them. Each classroom collected items...so many items that we filled 14 shoeboxes, and then I took them to the drop-off location to make their final journey across the world! Zion's preschool children learned that it is truly greater to give than to receive!

The Easter Seals organization also made a visit to Zion in Novem-The PreK and Stepping Stones children attended a Disability Awareness Program. Easter Seals sent 3 instructors who brought with them wheelchairs, crutches, voice machines, seeing eye dogs( stuffed, of course) and a whole bunch of other interesting items for the children to view and experiment with. The program taught the kids that people come in all different shapes, sizes, colors and some with disabilities. They learned not to be afraid just because someone has a wheelchair, or walks with crutches....that we were all created by God, each, our



own special way, and that they should try to help people with a disability when possible. The program was very interactive and greatly held the kids attention.

We ended our month with our Thanksgiving Feasts. Everyone brought in a special snack to share with their classmates, all while giving thanks to God.

Our Christmas program is on December 15<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm. Please come and hear our beautiful voices.

### **Membership Update**

Over a year ago the elders of Zion Lutheran Church, under the direction of the Pastor, began a process to define "self-exclusion" and work backwards to prevent people from falling into this category. When people commit to membership in our church, they promise to support the congregation with their



time, talent and treasure; they promise to attend worship and receive the sacrament of Holy Communion regularly. It is understandable that members of the church cannot attend worship every week. For some people, it is hard to get to church more than once a month. And while it is HIGHLY recommended and beneficial to make worship a weekly priority, the ins and outs of life sometimes prevent even the most well-intentioned Christian from making this a reality.

For those who are physically unable to attend worship, home visits are arranged and done on a monthly basis. (If you fit this category and would like a visit from the Pastor including in-home Communion, please contact the Church Office!) For those who work on Sunday, mid-week services in Advent and Lent are available. (We are looking at making a mid-week worship opportunity available on a continuing basis down the road.) With this in mind, the Elders defined "self-exclusion" as being absent from all worship services for one year. (Members of the Armed Forces and College Students were exempted from this policy.)

After three months of having this policy in place, the Elders received an attendance report from the Church Secretary, listing those members who had not recorded an attendance for the previous three months. Calls and e-mails were sent to these members, saying they were missed and that, if there was something wrong, we would like to know about it and expressed our concern for their spiritual well-being. The same process was undertaken at the six and nine month periods of inactivity. A final attempt at communication was made at the one-year mark of inactivity.

The good news is that the list of "inactives" at the end of the year was remarkably small for the size of our congregation and when compared to the first list we received at the three-month mark. Unfortunately, a number of people did fall into this category. And, after unanimous approval from the Board of Elders and Church Council, they were removed from the rolls of the church. Of those removed, the most recent recorded attendance was in December of 2008; many had no recorded attendance at all. One family had joined another congregation and forgot to terminate their membership at Zion. Another family had moved.



It is never a good thing to see people move away from participation in the corporate body of Christ. But we can take heart and be encouraged that membership in a congregation is not synonymous with salvation. People were removed from our membership rolls because of their failure to meet the requirements of membership, not because we believe they have lost their salvation. That being said, I ask that you pray for those who have been away from corporate worship for an uncomfortably long period of time; pray that they may see the value in worshiping the God of their salvation and coming together to receive gifts from their Savior Jesus.
