## The year at Zion that was...

2011

2011 was a very busy year for the members and staff of Zion. Below are just some of the highlights from last year.

We completed a 5-year plan that serves as a foundation for the seven key focus areas: Outreach, In-reach, Youth Ministry & Early Childhood Program, Worship Service, Stewardship, Technology, and Church and Parsonage Facilities.

We saw an increase in our community *Outreach* support throughout the year: Bridgeville Food Bank, Pittsburgh Community Lutheran High School, Lutherans for Life, World Relief (bars of soap), South Fayette Chili Cook-off (third place), Oktoberfest, paper recycling, aluminum can recycling (with the Boy Scouts), and a donation to Ian Loewe (a young boy from Pastor's previous church in Nebraska who is fighting cancer without health insurance). These are just some of our *Outreach* efforts of 2011.

Our *In-reach* activities were numerous as well. For example: Pirate Game, Golf Outing, Baby Shower, Interaction Group events and dinners, support for full-time church worker Rachael Quinlan, increase in Bible studies, and a new church directory for all members.

We also made great use of our facility: Boy Scouts, Lutherans for Life Strawberry Festival, Central Blood Bank Blood Drives, Preschool fundraiser (spaghetti dinner), Preschool Summer Camps, and Vacation Bible School.

We continued to show strong *Stewardship* with another balanced budget and no carry-over expenses from the previous budget year. This was accomplished throughout the year with increased Church, Mission & Synod (CMS) giving, special gifts, and strong expense control. The preschool continues to be self-funded and has shown strong growth and future potential growth.

We set an aggressive 3-month target to retire our outstanding mortgage of \$90,000. Together with our Lord's help, we accomplished this goal within the 3-month period. We plan to "Burn the Mortgage" next year, so keep an eye out for details. This accomplishment will now give us an opportunity to utilize these funds, which represents 9% of the budget, to establish a fund to support Zion's ministry. God does amazing things when you put your trust in him.



We consolidated the *Youth Ministry and Early Childhood* roles into one Director position. We added a new 5-year old Stepping Stones class and hired a number of new teachers and aides. We are now actively inviting the preschool children to participate in church activities: singing in church, hay ride/bonfire, etc. We saw an increase in the number of preschool students for the year.

The Youth had a number of team building activities and outings: bowling, skating, and confirmation lock-in where 30 kids showed up with a dozen or so non-member friends. The youth went on a mission trip to Lutheran Island Camp in Minnesota where they built an outdoor luggage rack for the female campers and a shed for recreation supplies. This camp has a significant outreach ministry in the community and serves the Lutheran Church in northern Minnesota. They also went on a grueling hike up Mt. Marcy in upstate New York.

We established a *Worship Service* team that is open to the congregation and meets on the third Thursday of each month to discuss ways we can improve the human aspects of worship at Zion. The choir continues to grow. We introduced multimedia to the Children's message and made some new ministry options and worship service trends. One of our key focus areas in our 2012 worship services will be on the Bible readings from the previous week in our "Read the Bible in a Year" schedule.

We now have the ability to live-stream video to our website with high speed *Technology* improvements made to our Internet. Zion's website continues to undergo major improvements with increased information content and features in the support of our members and community. The key objective is to proactively leverage technology to improve overall ministry.

Maintenance to *Church and Parsonage Facilities* represents 20% of the overall budget. So what did we do this past year? A lot! New carpeting for the church, school and parsonage, new furnace and air conditioning for the parsonage, cleaned and sealed the cross, new marquis sign, replaced the locks on the doors, fixed roof leaks, fixed the boiler, removed trees, plus lots of small maintenance projects. We will also be replacing our cleaning service with a part-time custodian (Jim Oelschlager, a member of Zion).

Overall, this year we have seen an increase in participation at church services, Bible studies, and new highs in preschool enrollment and vacation Bible school attendance.

On behalf of the Church Council, I want to thank the congregation, staff, officers and Pastor for their time, talent, prayers and gifts in support of growing the ministry of Zion. We thank our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for using Zion to share the Good News. These efforts have helped to "Build the Light of Zion and Let the SON Shine Out!"
