## The Call of the Wild!



Did you know that Zion is collecting **Box Tops for Education** to support Redeemer Lutheran School, the Pittsburgh area's first K through 12 Lutheran school?



Redeemer Lutheran School in Oakmont (a ministry of Redeemer Lutheran Church – LCMS), which until last year in-

cluded only elementary and middle grades, purchased a former Penn Hills School District building in 2011 in order to expand their classes through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. They now have a beautiful facility in which to house students, and a staff dedicated to serving the community through excellence in education from a distinctly Lutheran perspective.

So what are **Box Tops for Education**? ... How can they be used to support Redeemer Lutheran School? ... And, what about collecting Box Tops for Zion's Preschool programs???

We all shop for groceries, sometimes two or three times a week – or more. You can turn those shopping trips into easy cash for Redeemer School! Just look for the Box Tops logo on hundreds of products like Cheerios<sup>®</sup>, Hamburger Helper<sup>®</sup> and Kleenex<sup>®</sup>, in almost every aisle of the store. All you need to do is clip the small Box Top emblem from the packaging, and place them in the plastic container located on the specially marked table in the church fellowship hall. We will periodically send the collected box tops to Redeemer's Box Tops coordinator — each one is worth 10¢ for Redeemer to purchase items needed at the school, or to help lower-income families with tuition!

Unfortunately, Box Tops for Education are not able to be used in support of preschool programs such as Zion's . . . they may only be used for Kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade school programs.

We recently sent our first batch of approximately 300 Box Tops collected by Zion's Sunday School to Redeemer. We received the following letter in response from Redeemer's School Administrator, Mrs. Gail Holzer:

Dear Members of Zion:



Thank you very much for cutting and collecting the Box Tops for Education. Last year, with the help of our sister congregations, we collected nearly **\$2,000** for our scholarship fund with this program. It is such an easy way for us to get support for our students. We truly appreciate your partnership. It is a great privilege to serve the Kingdom in this manner, and we can't do it alone. You are a blessing to this school ministry. Thank you!
