Don't Celebrate Lent

Two weeks ago, Alissa became an aunt and I became an uncle for the first time. Theodore Joseph German was born to Paul and Alexandra German. We celebrated God's goodness and grace to our ever-expanding extended-family.

Last month, mom had a check-up with her oncologist. After beating cancer two years ago, she was (once again) pronounced cancer-free! We celebrated God's goodness and grace to our aging-buthealthy family.

We've also had occasion to celebrate the marriage of family and friends, new babies, jobs, promotions, wins, awards, degrees, friendships, and many others. Celebrating is fun. It's high-fives, cake, breaking open some bubbly, and kissing. It's a care-free moment that can do just fine without responsibility and worry. Which is why I am asking you not to celebrate Lent.

But today we repent. Today we confess. Today we recognize what it is we have been saved from, and what it took to save us from it.

Keep Lent? Yes. Remember Lent? Absolutely. Worship on Wednesdays during Lent? Please. But celebrate? Soon, but not today.


Children will learn about the tabernacle and discover how our sanctuary is a special place to worship God. Children will explore opportunities when we can use our time and skills to serve God through the church.
