### Epistle --Romans 7:1–13

Or do you not know, brothers—for I am speaking to those who know the law—that the law is binding on a person only as long as he lives? Thus a married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband dies she is released from the law of marriage. Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she lives with another man while her husband is alive. But if her husband dies, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress.

Likewise, my brothers, you also have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear fruit for God. For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our members to bear fruit for death. But now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us captive, so that we serve not under the old written code but in the new life of the Spirit.

What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the law, I would not have known sin. I would not have known what it is to covet if the law had not said, "You shall not covet." But sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. Apart from the law, sin lies dead. I was once alive apart from the law, but when the commandment came, sin came alive and I died. The very commandment that promised life proved to be death to me.

For sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it killed me. So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

Did that which is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, producing death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure.

# Going GREEN at Zion

Many people have recently asked if there will be any changes at Zion since Allegheny County has moved into the "green phase." Pastor Grimenstein and the Board of Elders have compiled a list of practices that will **CONTINUE** for now even after moving into the green phase, as well as **NEW** practices we will adopt. These practices are based on CDC guidelines for houses of worship as they re-open. In all things, the pastor and Board of Elders will



continue to monitor the Covid-19 situation so we can afford our members wors opportunities that are as safe as possible.

#### SUNDAY WORSHIP

- Worshippers will continue to sit in pews marked by white crosses (creating an 8-foot sep from others).
- All pews will be disinfected following each worship service with a bleach/water solution.
- No greeting line, sharing of peace, or passing of offering plates.
- Bulletins will not be recycled.
- Only 4-5 individuals or 1-2 family groups will be allowed at each side of the communion r
- All members are asked to please wear a mask when moving within the sanctuary (enterir leaving church, or when walking to communion).
- Masks and hand sanitizers will be provided at both entrances.
- The Sanctuary's fans/side air conditioners will continue to be utilized to increase airflow closed spaces per CDC suggestions.

#### ADDITIONAL SERVICES

- Wednesday evening service (7:00pm) will <u>continue.</u>
- NEW -- Thursday morning service (10:00am) will <u>no longer be offered.</u>
- NEW -- Saturday morning service (10:00am) will no longer be offered.

#### **BIBLE STUDY OPPORTUNITIES**

Wednesday evening Bible study (7:30pm) will remain <u>cancelled</u> for the time being.

- Thursday morning Bible study (10:00am) will remain cancelled for the time being.
- Saturday morning Men's Prayer Breakfast (8:00am) will remain cancelled for the time being.
- NEW -- Pastor's Sunday Adult Bible Study (Acts) will continue to be offered on the ZLCB.org website every Sunday through July 5<sup>th</sup>. The online version will no longer be available after July 5<sup>th</sup>. The study will <u>resume at 9:15am on Sunday July 12<sup>th</sup></u> for in-person attendance in the fellowship hall.
- **NEW** -- To better conform to CDC distancing guidelines, we will implement the following procedures during Adult Bible Study:
  - ⇒ Half of the tables will be removed and readjusted to ensure greater distance between persons.
  - ⇒ Chairs will be spaced appropriately for individuals (family groups may pull their chairs together).
  - ⇒ Breakfast items will continue to be offered. Each item will be wrapped and sealed individually. All utensils will be disposable. Individual juice boxes will be provided rather than from a common container.
  - ⇒ Shared surfaces (coffee pot handles and countertops) will be periodically disinfected.
  - ⇒ Shared Bibles will no longer be available in the back. Members are encouraged to bring their own or utilize the scripture passages on the front screen.
  - ⇒ All members are asked to please wear a mask when moving within the fellowship hall (entering and leaving or while preparing a refreshment).
  - ⇒ Hand sanitizers will be provided, and their use is encouraged before and after getting a refreshment.

Pastor Grimenstein and the Board of Elders are very grateful for the maturity and respect the members of Zion have shown to one another during the past three months. As we move forward together, may we continue to gather, receive the gifts Christ has won for us, and care for one another in the best ways possible.

# What is a "catechism"?

A catechism (pronounced KAT-eh-kizm) is a book of instruction usually written in question and answer form. The word "catechism" comes from the Greek word katekhein, which means "to instruct." A catechism teaches the basics of the Christian faith.

# Why do we need catechisms?

While visiting local churches, Martin Luther found many pastors and their church members were unaware of the true teachings of the Bible. Because of this, the people were living

immoral lives. Martin Luther wrote the catechisms to instruct people in the basics of the Christian faith, that they might know Christ and His forgiveness and

live accordingly. We still use Luther's Large and Small Catechisms so that we never forget those things that are necessary for faith in Christ.



Parents: Consider these words from Luther: "I, too, am a theologian who has attained a fairly good practical knowledge and experience of Holy Scriptures through various dangers. But I do not so glory in this gift as not to join my children daily in prayerfully reciting the Catechism. ... For God gave the Word that we should impress it on ourselves. ... Without this practice our souls become rusty, as it were, and we lose ourselves" (Plass, Ewald M., What Luther Says vol. 1 [St. Louis: Concordia, 1986], 125–26).
