


Welcome to Zion Lutheran Church & Preschool!

Communion Statement

We believe that in the Lord's Supper, Christ's physical body and blood are present in the bread and wine (1Cor. 11:23-25). We also believe receiving the Lord's Supper is an act of church fellowship. Scripture cautions that those who receive without recognizing Christ's body and blood will bring judgment upon themselves (1 Cor. 11:27-29). Therefore, out of love to our guests, we invite to our altar those who are baptized, confirmed, repentant members of Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod congregations or sister congregations. Visitors desiring to commune are asked to please announce their intentions to an elder or pastor. Everyone is welcome to sing the hymns during communion as we contemplate Christ's mercy to us.







Holy Gospel

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the fourteenth chapter.



Now when Jesus heard [about the death of John], he withdrew from there in a boat to a desolate place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them and healed their sick. Now when it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a desolate place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves." But Jesus said, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." They said to him, "We ave only five loaves here and two fish." And he said, "Bring them here to me." Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass, and taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and said a blessing. Then he broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces left over. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

Zion's Worshipping Guidelines During the Pandemic

UPDATED JULY 6th

As directives regarding public gatherings continue to change from state/local authorities, Zion's Board of Elders and Pastor Grimenstein have enacted the guidelines below to support public worship during the pandemic. Pastor and the Elders will continue to revisit these guidelines and adjust them as needed.

SUNDAY WORSHIP

- Worshippers will continue to sit in pews marked by white crosses (creating a 6-foot separation from others). All pews will be disinfected following each worship service with a bleach/water solution.
- Masks and hand sanitizers will be provided at both entrances. All members are asked to please
 wear a mask when moving within the sanctuary (entering and leaving church, or when walking to
 communion).
- No greeting line, sharing of peace, or passing of offering plates. Bulletins will not be recycled.
- Only 4-5 individuals or 1-2 family groups will be allowed at each side of the communion rail.
- The Sanctuary's fans/side air conditioners will continue to be utilized to increase airflow within closed spaces per CDC suggestions.

OTHER WORSHIP SERVICES

- Wednesday evening service (7:00pm) will <u>continue</u>.
- Saturday morning service (10:00am) will **continue**. The participant number will be a total of **25** (*23 worshippers*, *1 elder*, *1 pastor*). Visit Worship Sign-Up Genius to sign up, or call Susie Bishop at 412 -977-9066. Saturday's readings and sermon will be the same as the following Sunday's.

What does "worship" really mean?

Most people use the word "worship" to mean something we do to honor God. Because of this misunderstanding, many people believe that a church service is what we do for God. The word "worship" comes from the root words "worth" and "ship." These two words describe God rather than the ones praising Him. These words describe a God who is worthy of being honored and adored because of His love for us. God gives us His love through His Word and Sacraments. Worship is not something we do, but rather something that God does for us!

What makes the Divine Service so important?

The Divine Service is not about what we are doing for God, but who God is and what He does for us in the ways He has promised: His Word and Sacraments. That's why Lutherans call it *Divine Service*. God is serving us! What a wonderful God we have!


