

Communion Statement

If you are visiting us today from another Christian denomination, we welcome you to come to the altar to receive a baptismal blessing. Please signify by crossing your arms over your chest upon kneeling.





Epistle Reading – James 3:13–4:10

Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

What causes quarrels and what causes fights among you? Is it not this, that your passions are at war within you? You desire and do not have, so you murder. You covet and cannot obtain, so you fight and quarrel. You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions. You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God. Or do you suppose it is to no purpose that the Scripture says, "He yearns jealously over the spirit that he has made to dwell in us"? But he gives more grace. Therefore it says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. Be wretched and mourn and weep. Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to gloom. Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you.


Apostles' Creed





As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.








Post-Communion Collect



A recap of today's SS teaching for Zion Parents & Students

BIBLE VERSE

Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you. Psalm 50:15

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

Following ten terrible plagues, Pharaoh relents and releases the Israelites to worship in the wilderness. Realizing the Israelites have no intention of returning, Pharaoh's army pursues the runaways. Caught between Pharaoh's charioteers and the waters of the Red Sea, the people cry out to God. Moses stretches his hand over the sea as God parts the waters, enabling the people to pass through the sea on dry ground. As Egypt's army attempts to follow, the sea closes in over them, so not one survives.

TAKING IT HOME

- On the Go—What do you think the experience of crossing the Red Sea on dry ground would have been like? How would it feel to have fish swimming next to you? Would you be afraid of the army approaching behind you?
- At Mealtime—Talk about a time when you felt like the people of Israel, trapped between the Red Sea and the Egyptian army. How does this story give you confidence in God's presence?
- Something to Do—Moses and the people of Israel sang songs of praise to God, thanking Him for their freedom and protection from the Egyptians. Sing a song of praise together, like "O Sing to the Lord" (LSB 808).
- Before Bed—Say a prayer together, thanking God for the way He blesses us through the waters of Holy Baptism, just as He blessed the Israelites, protecting them from the waters of the Red Sea.



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KIDS IN THE DIVINE SERVICE

What is "making the sign of the cross"?



Making the sign of the cross means to draw an invisible cross on yourself at certain times during personal prayer, the Divine Service and other appropriate times during worship.

How do I make the sign of the cross?

Hold your thumb and two fingers together. 1 Touch your forehead, 2 then your tummy, 3 your left shoulder, 3 then your right shoulder 5 and finally your chest. Try it a few times and you'll get it. Before long, it will be easy to do!

Why is it a great thing to do?

Can you think of a time when your pastor first made the sign of the cross on you? At your Baptism, you received the sign of the cross on your forehead and on your heart to mark you as one redeemed by Christ! Making the sign of the cross is a great way to remember all that Jesus has done for you on the cross and given to you in and through Baptism!

Parents: Before or after the service, practice making the sign of the cross with your children. Remind them that we may make the sign of the cross at certain times during the service, for example, anytime you see a small red "cross" symbol, or pastor makes the sign of the cross on the congregation.

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
