
Welcome to Zion Lutheran Church & Preschool!

Communion Statement

A recap of today's SS teaching for Zion parents & students

BIBLE VERSE

[Jesus says,] "I am the Good Shepherd."

John 10:11

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

Jesus calls Himself the Good Shepherd as He promises to lead and guide His sheep. Jesus willingly laid down His life for His sheep, even those who often ignore the voice of the Shepherd. His flock includes "other sheep," Gentiles not descended from Abraham (v. 16). David's familiar Twenty-third Psalm describes the work of our Good Shepherd.

TAKING IT HOME

- On the Go—Who has Jesus put in your life to help shepherd you in the faith? When do you hear Jesus speaking through these people?
- At Mealtime—When did Jesus lay down His life for you, as the shepherd does for the sheep? What do you have because of Jesus' death and resurrection? Describe this abundant (full to overflowing) life you have received.
- Something to Do—Together, sing the three stanzas of "I Am Jesus' Little Lamb" (Lutheran Service Book 740).
- Before Bed—We often hear about Jesus as our Good Shepherd and read Psalm 23 at funerals or on other church occasions. Read the psalm together. What is your favorite part? Thank Jesus for caring for you always.

Why do we celebrate Lent for 40 days?

Don't forget what Lent is all about! It is a time when we are reminded of what Jesus gave up for us, and a time when we look forward to and prepare for His death and resurrection!



We celebrate Lent for six weeks, or 40 days, as we remember Christ's temptation in the wilderness in the Gospel of Matthew. There Jesus was without food for 40 days.



We remember the temptation of **the Israelites in the desert** after the Lord had delivered them from Egypt. This lasted 40 years.



Finally, we can remember the story of **Noah and his family**. After 40 days and 40 nights of rain, the Lord delivered them as He promised.

During these 40 days of Lent, we remember God's faithfulness to His people and how His faithfulness is complete in Jesus, our Savior. Jesus remains faithful to us, always being where He promises to be: in His Word and Sacraments. Wow! What a Savior!



Parents: Continue to encourage your children in their Lenten preparation. During worship, point out the places where our Lord comes to us (i.e. God's Word, Holy Communion, Holy Baptism, Absolution). Remember, being their example and companion on this Lenten journey makes a difference!
