

## **Communion Statement**

We believe that in the Lord's Supper, Christ's physical body and blood are present in the bread and wine (1 Cor. 11:23-25). We also believe receiving the Lord's Supper is an act of church fellowship. Scripture cautions that those who receive without recognizing Christ's body and blood will bring judgment upon themselves (1 Cor. 11:27-29). Therefore, out of love to our guests, we invite to our altar to receive the Lord's Supper those who are baptized, confirmed, repentant members of Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod congregations or sister congregations. If you are visiting us today from another Christian denomination, we welcome you to come to the altar to receive a baptismal blessing. Please signify by crossing your arms over your chest upon kneeling.

## **Our Worship**

Our worship services are based on traditional church liturgies in which God speaks to us in His Word and we respond to Him. These liturgies were used by the early church almost 2000 years ago and are rich in scriptural meaning, connecting us to our past -- and future -- in Christ Jesus. There is a depth to Lutheran worship that can take time to appreciate, thus you may find that you don't understand everything that is happening the first week you visit. That's OK, we encourage you to keep visiting!




#### Epistle Reading – 2 Timothy 3:14–4:5

As for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work.

I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. As for you, always be sober-minded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.



## The Words of Our Lord



This Week in Zion Sunday School A recap of today's SS teaching for parents & students

#### BIBLE VERSE

Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding.

Proverbs 3:5

#### SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

When Isaac is sixty years old, Rebekah gives birth to very different twin boys—Esau and Jacob. Isaac ignores God's promise to Jacob and favors Esau. Esau's hunger gets the best of him as he sells his birthright for a bowl of stew. Rebekah enables further deception as she plots with Jacob, her favored son, so that he receives Isaac's blessing. When Esau vows to kill Jacob, Rebekah sends Jacob away for his own safety.

#### TAKING IT HOME

- On the Go—Esau would have inherited a double portion of Isaac's possessions because of his birthright. How did Esau's selling of his birthright to Jacob show that he did not respect Isaac?
- At Meal Time—Rebekah helped Jacob receive a special blessing from his father. Did her plans work out? How does this show that our human choices are affected by sin?
- Something to Do—Read or recite the Ten Commandments. Which commandments remind you of today's Bible story? How might things have been different if the family in the Bible account had listened to God's Commandments?
- Before Bed—Jacob did not deserve his father's inheritance or blessing, but he received them anyway. How is this like the gift of faith you have received through Christ?

## Who is the Holy Spirit?

The explanation of the Small Catechism says, the Holy Spirit is "the

third person in the Holy Trinity, true God with the Father and Son." This means that we believe in one true God, in three persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is God just as the Father is God and the Son is God.

## What does the Holy Spirit do?

The Holy Spirit sanctifies God's people. In other words, He makes us holy by giving us saving faith in Jesus and the strength to lead godly lives in His name.

## Why is the Holy Spirit so important?

We need the Holy Spirit and what He gives to us, because without Him, we are not able to believe in Jesus. In 1 Cor. 2:14 we hear the following: "The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned." The Holy Spirit calls us to faith through the Gospel and delivers the gracious gifts of salvation in the Sacraments.

#### Parents:

During the service, tell your children to listen for times the Pastor says the name of the Holy Spirit (i.e. the Invocation, Benediction). Remind your children that the Holy Spirit is exactly where God promised us He would be — in the Word and Sacraments. He comes to us by no other means than through these gracious gifts.

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
