

Communion Statement

We believe that in the Lord's Supper, Christ's physical body and blood are present in the bread and wine (1 Cor. 11:23-25). We also believe receiving the Lord's Supper is an act of church fellowship. Scripture cautions that those who receive without recognizing Christ's body and blood will bring judgment upon themselves (1 Cor. 11:27-29). Therefore, out of love to our guests, we invite to our altar to receive the Lord's Supper those who are baptized, confirmed, repentant members of Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod congregations or sister congregations. If you are visiting us today from another Christian denomination, we welcome you to come to the altar to receive a baptismal blessing. Please signify by crossing your arms over your chest upon kneeling.

Our Worship

Our worship services are based on traditional church liturgies in which God speaks to us in His Word and we respond to Him. These liturgies were used by the early church almost 2000 years ago and are rich in scriptural meaning, connecting us to our past -- and future -- in Christ Jesus. There is a depth to Lutheran worship that can take time to appreciate, thus you may find that you don't understand everything that is happening the first week you visit. 




















Salutation and Collect of the Day








Service of the Sacrament

- P Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My + body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

 In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My + blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."
- As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

A recap of today's SS teaching for parents & students

BIBLE VERSE

[Forgive] one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

Ephesians 4:32

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

Joseph's siblings journey to Egypt hoping to find food for their family. Failing to recognize Joseph, the brothers head home with sustenance and supplies. Heeding Joseph's early warning, the brothers bring Benjamin when returning to Egypt for food. After testing and trying his brothers, Joseph finally reveals himself to his astonished siblings. Joseph relocates all of Jacob's family to Egypt, promising to care for them.

TAKING IT HOME

- On the Go—Joseph could have been angry, but instead he showed love and mercy to his brothers. How did he do this? How does God show mercy to you? Why does God show you mercy?
- At Meal Time—What was Judah willing to do for Benjamin (read Genesis 44:33)? How does Judah remind you of Jesus in this story?
- Something to Do—Make a collage using pictures from old magazines or the internet. Look for pictures representing emotions like anger, sadness, and frustration. Talk about how people look and act when they feel hurt or upset. Next, look for images that represent peace, joy, and contentment. Place these next to the other images, and talk about how people look and act when they receive forgiveness.
- Before Bed—Talk about a time God made something good happen, even though things started out badly. What is the greatest "good thing" God has done for you? With whom can you share this good gift from above?

What is "All Saints' Day"?

All Saints' Day is the day during the Church
Year that we celebrate, remember and honor
all of those who have died with faith in Jesus and
are now with Him in heaven.

Why do we celebrate All Saints' Day?

The word "saint" comes from the Latin word sanctus which means "holy" or "sacred." Saints are God's holy people. We thank God for the saints who have gone before us because of their great example of faith and God's great mercy in their lives!

Do you have to die to be a saint?

No way! All of God's faithful people are His saints! We were washed clean of our sins at our Baptism and made holy before God. That's what it means when we hear God's Word say:

"These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb" (Rev. 7:14). Isn't it great to know that it is not what we have done that makes us a saint, but what Jesus has done for us through His death and resurrection? He gives all of this to us through Baptism. He is the one who makes us a saint!



Parents: Talk to your children about those in your own family who have died in the faith. Explain that they are now with Jesus in heaven. Remind them that this is a fulfillment of God's promises at our Baptism.
